United Way advances health and wellness by improving health care accessibility for individuals of all ages in Central Virginia.

94% of target children had a primary health care provider within 2 months of enrollment in the program or birth of child.

4,988 individuals were provided 11,251 medical appointments.

Scholars gained 3 months of reading skills and 2.5 months of math skills during summer.

28% of children are not reading at grade level by the end of third grade (Achievement gap: Whites – 21% Blacks – 41%)

Health

\$5 per week provides for the full training of a CASA volunteer as they complete the mandatory eight week pre-service training class.

Education

\$10 per week provides students in an after-school tutorial program a backpack filled with school supplies.

Income

\$1 per week provides bus passes for 13 local families to help them get to doctors appointments, the grocery store and other community resources.

Basic Human Needs

\$2 per week provides three families of four with 2 meals a day for five days.
