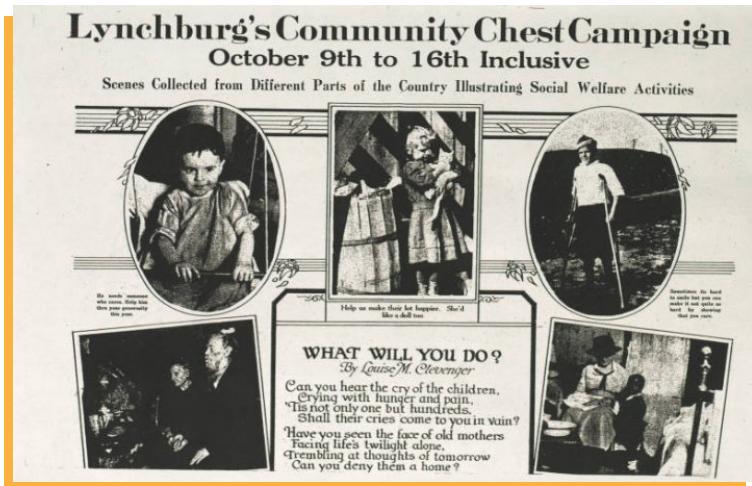

Our History

United Way of Central Virginia dates back to 1921 when a group of community leaders established the Lynchburg Community Chest. D.B. Ryland of the Lynchburg Chamber of Commerce helped coordinate this effort with Floyd Knight, Richard Hancock, R.A. Owen, R.T. Watts, Jr., Giles Miller and M.O. Carruthers. The first community campaign took place in 1922 and raised \$85,825.

While the initial years of the Community Chest focused on fundraising, community planning was soon an important part of our work. In 1949, the Junior League organized and financed a group to study community needs on a year-round basis. Called the Lynchburg Community Council, it represented 76 health and social service organizations. The Council received funding from the Community Chest and then the two organizations merged in 1954 to become the Lynchburg Community Chest and Council.

The organization continued its work in identifying and responding to the needs of the community, but decided to change its name to the United Fund of Lynchburg in 1957. This was the last name to include Lynchburg in its wording. In 1973, the organization changed its name to United Way of Central Virginia to reflect its work in serving the entire region.

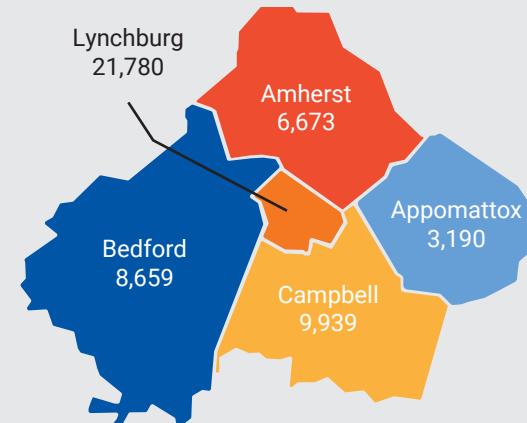

Focus Area: Education

United Way ensures every child gets a strong start in life and has the opportunity to become a contributing member of society.

Our Goal

To address barriers such as lack of access to high quality early learning programs, adverse childhood experiences, trauma, chronic absence and summer learning loss so that children will enter kindergarten ready to learn, read at grade level in third grade, graduate on-time, and succeed in school and in life.

Community Challenges

- 70** children are born for every one quality childcare slot
- 32%** of children do not pass third grade reading scores
- 3** months in math and reading lost in summer by economically disadvantaged students



Bright Beginnings Central Virginia (BBCV), the early childhood initiative of UWCV, brings together local leaders from school systems, childcare and preschool programs, community services, businesses and individuals to work together to ensure that every child in Central Virginia enters kindergarten with skills needed to succeed in school and in life.



BBCV serves as an effective systems builder, implementing innovative strategies to ensure that high quality early care and education programs are available to all children. BBCV's Mixed Delivery program provided childcare to 133 children this year, at carefully selected private childcare centers.

In 2022, BBCV was the steward of \$1.8 million to invest in early childhood education. This year, 216 professional development hours were offered to 756 attendees. BBCV also launched a new partnership with Beacon of Hope to place interns in early education programs. In this pilot year, 6 interns were placed.



Here is how your support helped your neighbors:

Your investment helped improve the educational outcomes of our children by funding 9 local programs that provided positive role models, summer classes in math and reading, and after-school programs that engaged students throughout the school year.

What was the impact?

Thanks to your support, United Way funded programs were able to affect real change in our community. Here are just a few of these programs' outcomes:

- 81%** of children in afterschool programs maintained a C or above in CORE subjects
- 2** months of reading skills and **2.5** months of math skills gained by scholars
- 151** children participated in DEAR Time (Drop Everything and Read) to enhance reading skills

- 42%** of Virginia's Kindergarteners entered Kindergarten without the resources, opportunities, and experiences to be successful in one or more critical learning domains
- 68%** of children from birth to five do not have access to licensed childcare

- 1,000** Summer Learning Kits distributed to children who will begin Kindergarten in August 2023
- 5,630** books mailed to **550** children enrolled in Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

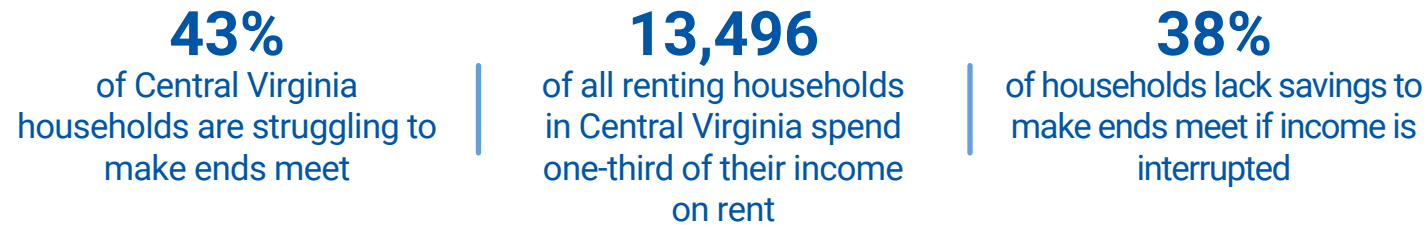
Focus Area: Financial Stability

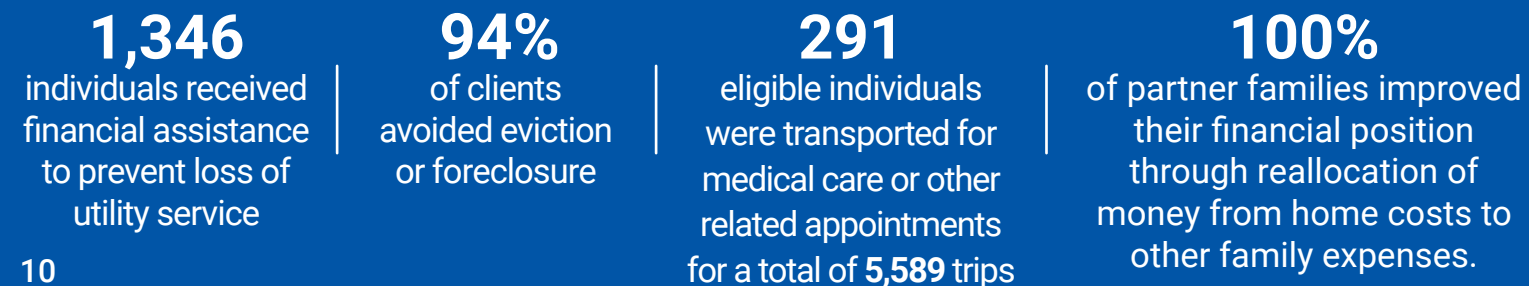

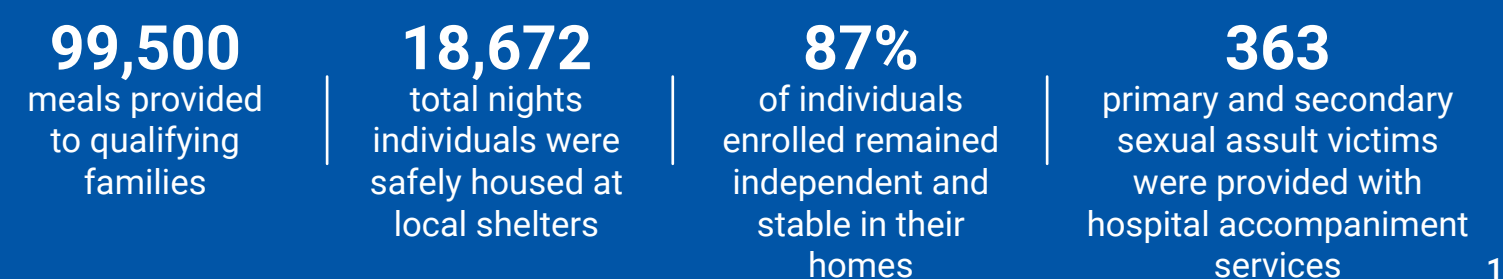

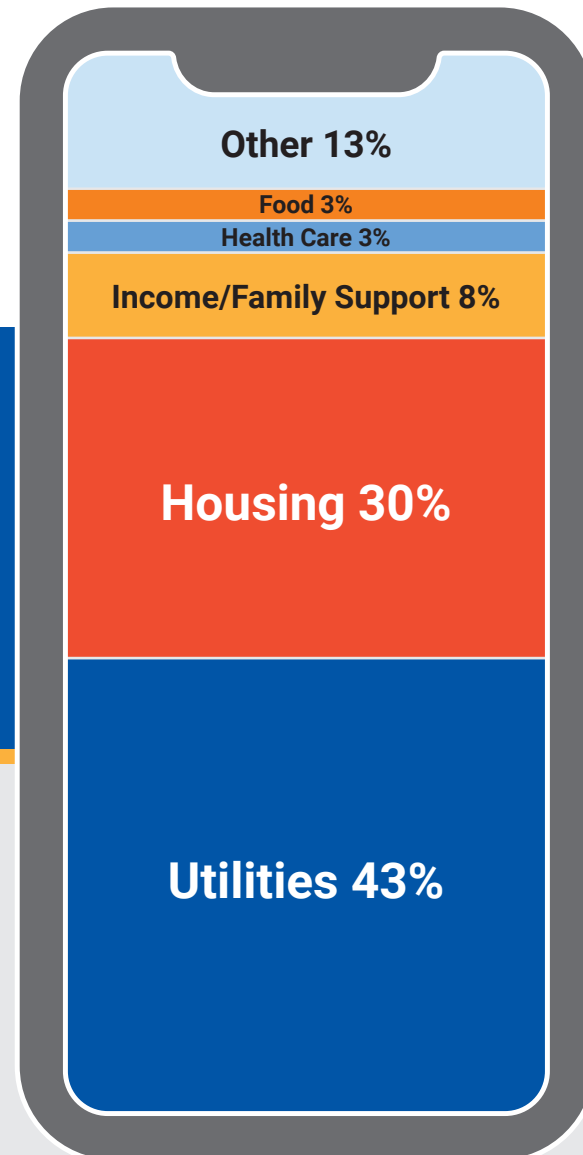
Focus Area: Basic Needs

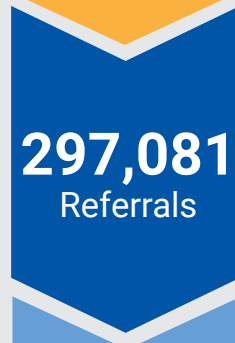

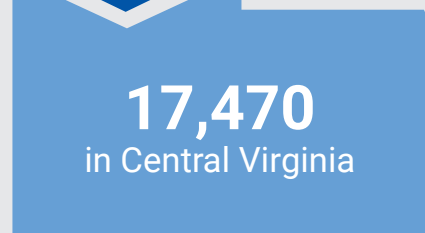

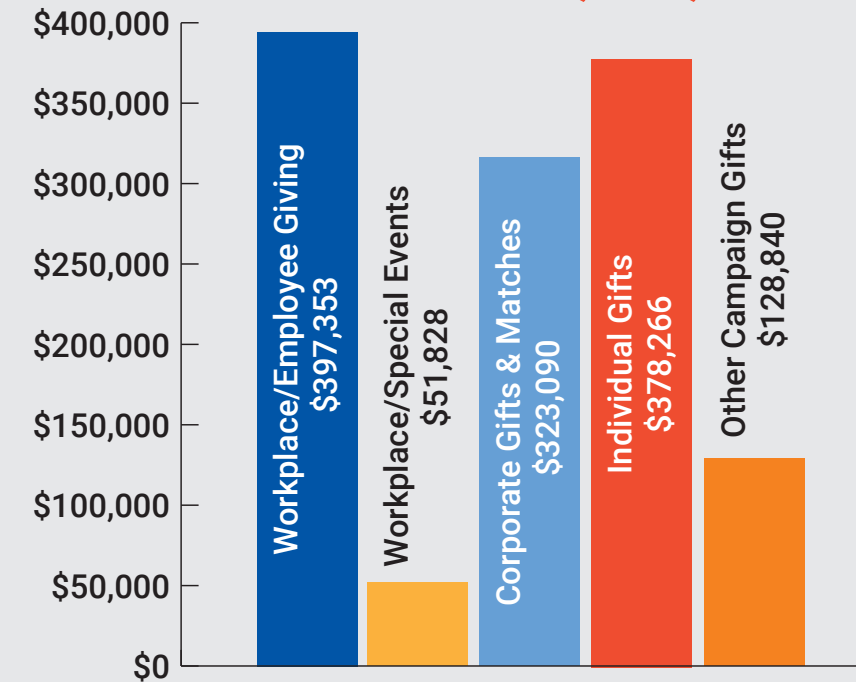

Independent community members are intensively involved in developing our budget and monitoring our performance monthly, and they lead the process for determining how funds are distributed throughout the community.

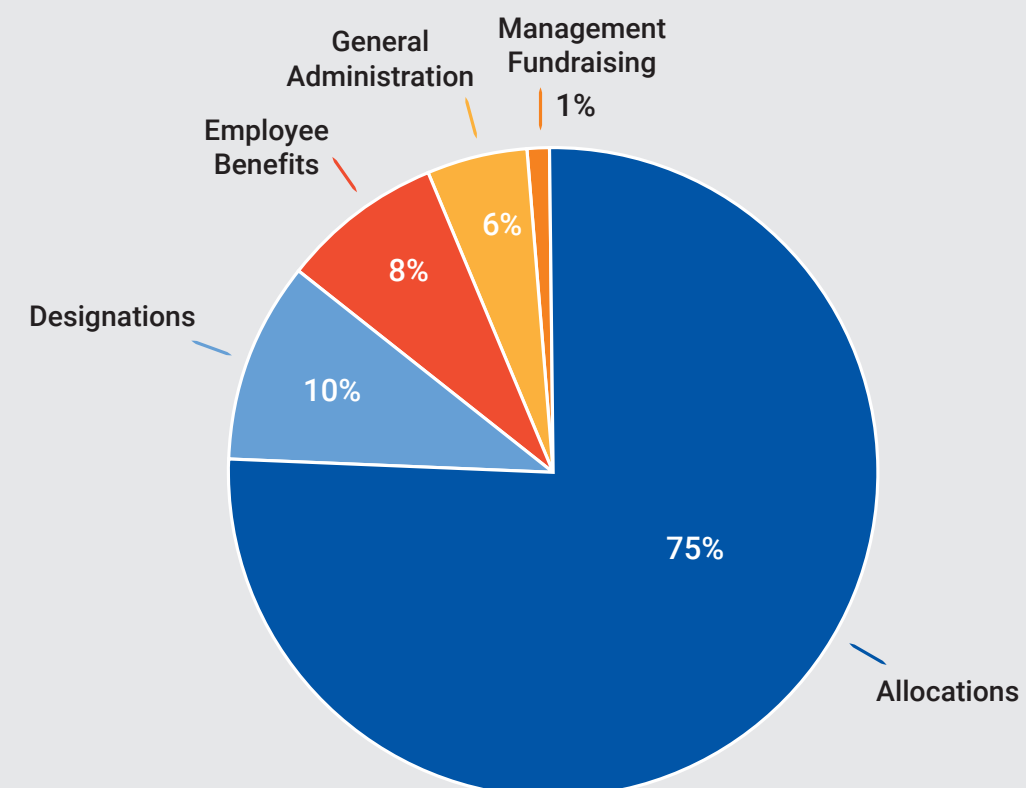
