## HERE ARE SOME EXAMPLES **OF HOW YOUR DONATIONS IMPACT YOUR COMMUNITY:**

#### \$1 per Week

Provides a full day of shelter for one person including breakfast, lunch, dinner, a cot, two blankets and a comfort kit.

Supports financial assistance for 2 children for one week of after school care.

### \$2 per Week

Provides emergency services to five sexual assault victims.

Provides three families of four with 10 meals per person. (120 total meals)

### \$5 per Week


Provides bus passes for one week for up to 20 shelter residents to go on job interviews.

Sponsors three weeks for a child in the after school tutorial program.

## \$10 per Week

Provides diapers, wipes and formula for 10 infants whose family has been impacted by a disaster/ emergency occurrence.

Helps one patient receive one full year of life-saving medications.
